There have been quite a few happenings since the fall issue of the SCanner. First, the ANA held an historic election for the Board of Directors and an entire new slate of board members have been installed and they subsequently removed its Executive Director. The updated Board and officer list is located on page 2 of the SCanner. I also am pleased to announce a new ad exchange agreement with the Georgia Numismatic Association (GNA). 35th Anniversary Convention a Historic Event

This is the hardest and most time consuming job in putting on a convention, and may be the least appreciated, since so much work goes on behind the scenes. Tony also did a great job at setting up the show along with some help from **Hugh Shull** and myself. I was these early which gave me a chance to witness all of the activity.

Everyone involved seems to really like the Embassy Suites that had been our home for the last three years. This will change next year as the show moves to the Carolina First Center just off Pleasantburg Drive. This new location will have the advantage of providing more bourse space. Actually this new venue is not new to us. The building was formally known as the Palmetto Expo Center and is where we held our 2000 and 2001 conventions.

LODZ GHETTO

Currency is more then a medium of exchange, it often has a story to tell. It can commemorate or represent people, places and events in history. But unfortunately, not all of the stories are proud moments for mankind.

On September 1, 1939 Hitler launched an attack against Poland and the country fell three weeks later. On November 7, 1939 the city of Lodz was incorporated into the Third Reich and its name changed to Litzmannstadt (Litzmann's city) in honor of German World War I General Karl Litzmann, who died trying to conquer Lodz in 1915.

Lodz was the second the largest Jewish community in Europe, the largest community being in Warsaw. A ghetto was established in a 4.3 square kilometer area in the northern section of the city and 230,000 Jews were moved in and the area was sealed off on May 1, 1940. Mordekchai Chaim Rumkowski was appointed as the Judenäelteste (Elder of the Jews) and set up his own bureaucracy. The Germans mandated that the Jews pay for their own food, security, sewage removal and other expenses. Rumkowski arranged to set up factories within the ghettos and in exchange for the final products the Germans would pay the Jews in food, which Rumkowski controlled and rationed. Those who worked were issued ghetto money and they could purchase their rations from the ghetto stores. The ghetto money was nicknamed "Rumkies" after Rumkowski, whose signature appears on the face of the notes. Outside the ghetto the money was worthless.

The Nazis declared it illegal for ghetto residents to possess hard currency, so they were forced to exchange their German and Polish currency for quittungen (currency receipts). These were to function as currency, and were issued in values of 50 pfennig and 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 mark. The face reads "Quittung Uber (denomination), Der Aelteste der Juden in Litzmannstadt, M. Rumkowski, Litzmannstadt, den 15 Mai 1940". This translates to "Receipt for (denomination), the Chief Elder of the Jews in Litzmannstadt, May 15, 1940." The back states the denomination, with a warning against counterfeiting. Both sides have a background mesh pattern that is actually a series of Stars of David. They were printed by the Manitius Printing House.

Coins were also issued. In 1942, 5 and 10 pfennig trial patterns and a 10 pfennig coin were produced in magnesium. In 1943, 5, 10 and 20 mark coins were issued in aluminum and 5 and 10 mark in magnesium as well.

The magnesium used to produce the coins was manufactured from pieces of downed Allied aircraft. The obverse of the mark coins have a Star of

David and the word "GETTO", surrounded with a double-lined circle with six interspersed Stars of David and the date 1943. The reverse states "DER AELESTE DER JUDEN/ IN LITZMANNSTADT". The denomination is in the center, with a banner running across it stating "QUITTUNG UBER".

In 1941 25,000 Jews and gypsies from other areas were moved into the ghetto. Also in 1941 deportations were started from Lodz to the Chelmno death camp. The deportations to Chelmno continued until 1944 when the Soviets were closing in on Chelmno. Most of the remaining inhabitants, including Rumkowski, were then sent to Auschwitz death camp. Some workers were kept in the ghetto to confiscate any remaining material and valuables. They were rescued by the Red Army in 1945. The reports list from anywhere from 877 to 7,000 survivors from the Lodz ghetto but 220,000 to 250,000 perished.

GUIDELINES FOR SCNA EDUCATIONAL GRANT AWARD

Applicants for the Young Numismatists Educational Grant Award must have been a member of the SCNA and a SCNA Member Club for at least 1 year prior to applying. The applicant must be between 13 and 17 years of age and have a minimum C average in school.

YNs will be judged on their contributions to their local coin club, SCNA, plus their accomplishments in school, church or community activities.

An applicant must have <u>at least 2</u> nominations. One nomination must be from his or her local coin club or from a SCNA member who personally knows them. The other nomination should be from a school professional, church or community leader who is involved with the nominee in one or more of these activities. Nominations should describe the applicant's contributions to the group. The applicant should also write a letter of self-nomination stating why he/she would like to attend an ANA Summer Seminar.

Previous SCNA scholarship/educational grant award recipients are not eligible. *At least 3 applications* must be received before the grant is awarded. If a Young Numismatist Educational Grant Award is granted, SCNA will match funds up to \$500.

The decision of the SCNA Young Numismatist Educational Grant Award Committee is final. Any questions about the nominating procedure should be directed to the SCNA Secretary.

The three (3) letters should be mailed separately to the SCNA Secretary and must be received by March 15, 2008. The winning applicant will be notified on or before June 1, 2008.


