TRYING TO PUT A PAIR TOGETHER

One of my collecting interests is hand-engraved coins, known as love tokens. Men gave these to women as a show of affection. They could be engraved with initials (one or more), names, dates, sayings, or scenes that were significant to the couple. Love tokens first became popular in this country around the time of the War of Northern Aggression.

Love token collectors often wonder about the coins that they own. What was the story behind the love token? Some were pierced. Did the lady wear it on a chain? If it has more than one hole, was it part of a necklace or bracelet or some other type of jewelry? Is the coin a single piece or one of a pair that was engraved the same but became separated from its mate?

A few years ago I learned the answer to that last question as it relates to a coin in my collection.

Before a Baltimore Coin Club meeting I took one of my love tokens to put in the club auction. (I sometimes put love tokens in club auctions to try to generate some interest in this part of the hobby.) The coin was part of a 100-piece collection that I bought from a friend. The engraving and the host coin had no particular significance to me. Before the meeting/auction, I was looking at love tokens on eBay. I saw in the listing one that was engraved GJ. Although those letters were not letters that I was searching for, I decided to take a look at the coin anyway. I was surprised to see that it was the twin to the one that I was going to auction.

Both are similarly-toned AU 1892 Barber dimes, with the reverse smoothed and engraved. Each is pierced at the top with a single hole and the holes are the same size. Neither has a border and both have plain backgrounds. The engraving is as

identical as hand engraving will ever be. They were obviously made at the same time, by the same artist.

I decided not to auction my **GJ** and tried to win the eBay piece. I bid much more than I usually would for a coin like this, as I wanted to re-unite the two. I was outbid at the very end. I then contacted the winning bidder (you could do that at that time) and offered my piece, with an explanation, at a price below what he/she had bid, still wanting the two pieces together. I did not get a reply.

I still look for that piece on eBay. Maybe one day...
