A Replica of a \$20 Love Token

The March 2010 issue of the American Numismatic Association's *The Numismatist* published an article about the Confederate submarine C.S.S. H. L. Hunley. The story included information about an 1860 gold \$20 coin that had stopped a bullet at the Battle of Shiloh and saved the life of Confederate Lieutenant George E. Dixon., who carried it in his pocket. The Double Eagle was a gift from his girlfriend. He had the bent coin engraved SHILOH./APRIL 6th/1862/ MY LIFE PRESERVER/ G.E.D.

In 1995 the coin was found in the raising of the Hunley, discovered outside the Charleston Harbor. Lt. Dixon had command of the Hunley when it sank.

I have a copy of that bent \$20 coin. A fellow member in the Myrtle Beach Coin Club put it in the club auction on May 17. The opening bid was \$1 and I won it at \$5. The replica, also bent, is very well done and, of course, has "COPY" inconspicuously noted on the engraved side.

The "coin" raised several question. Who made it? How many were produced? Why? What is the market for such a piece? I bought it because it is a replica of a love token (my first replica).

I did a little research and discovered the coin on the "Friends of the Hunley" web page. It is but one of several collectibles sold to raise money for the restoration of the sub (the first to ever sink an enemy war ship). It costs \$10.

This one may qualify as the most unusual piece in my love token collection.

SCNA PATCH HISTORY

(Third in a series of three articles.)

Over the history of the South Carolina Numismatic Association's existence, there have been three emissions of membership patches.

The **ORGINAL PATCH**, distinguishable by its **dark green** background, was designed by **George Crocker**, SCNA's first President, and was placed on the distinctive green jackets worn by the officers at the first convention in **1973**. To my knowledge, only one original green coat with the original patch on it still exists. Further, I know of only one patch that was removed from an original coat that still exists. I would be pleased to learn of any others.

The **SECOND PATCH**, with a **lighter color green** background, like the five-color patch that was printed on high quality paper for the <u>SCanner</u> cover design for years, and thus, became known as the <u>SCanner</u> patch," was produced in **1985** and was offered for sale to members at \$5.00 each and for however they pleased.

The **THIRD PATCH**, the "SHEHEEN PATCH," so-called because Austin M. Sheheen Jr. had them made in **September**, **1987**, is a very close copy of the original with minor design differences apparent only upon close scrutiny. The pattern for this patch was made by computer from the original. The initial order for 50 patches, placed some four years previously, was not executed due to the high cost estimate of \$400 for the pattern and \$10 for each patch for a total of \$900 or \$18 per patch.

As a favor to Austin, the producer cut the total cost to \$250 or \$5.00 per patch. Actually, 58 patches were delivered, including the sample. Austin paid for the order himself and donated the 50 patches plus a check for \$100 to SCNA to begin an **Endowment Fund** for the organization with the patches being sold at \$10 each to add to the fund.





President Repeals 1099 Reporting

The National Health Care Law contained a little known requirement for businesses to report purchases over \$600 during a year's time. This reporting requirement extended all the way to the numismatic community and its dealers.

After much discussion and negotiations, the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate finally compromised on an acceptable version for the repeal of the 1099 provision. The bill was sent to the President who approved the cancelling of the problematic reporting requirement.

Georgia Exhibit Best in Show

Mack Martin captured the Best of Show Exhibit Award at the Central States Numismatic Society convention held in the Chicago suburb of Rosemont, Ill., in April 2011.

He was honored at the CSNS Awards Breakfast April 30 with a plaque by Exhibits Chair Fran Lockwood.

Martin's award-winning exhibit was titled, "State of Georgia Treasury Notes Treasury Certificates: 1861-1865."

Mr. Martin, a member of SCNA, has exhibited numerous award-winning exhibits around the nation. His exhibits have also won top awards at the past several SCNA Conventions.






